CALL FOR PAPERS

Introduction

Sino-African relations go back several centuries. For some scholars, trade links between China and African countries date back to the Song Dynasty (10th century); for others it dates back to the Ming Dynasty (14th century). Since the proclamation of the People's Republic of China by Mao Zedong on October 1, 1949 in Tiananmen Square, cooperation between African countries and China has made a new start, marked by several mutual visits by political authorities. We can list the visit to China of Mr. Félix Moumié of the Union of the Peoples of Cameroon in 1953, of President Sékou Touré in 1960, of President Kwame Nkrumah in 1961. We can also mention the visits of the Chinese Premier Zhou Enlai between December 1963 and February 1964 to 10 African countries.

Sino-African relations in the 21st century are marked by the creation in 2000 of the Forum on China-Africa Cooperation (FOCAC), which established a platform for exchange and a multilateral cooperation mechanism between China and African countries. More recently, in November 2021, the 8th Conference of FOCAC was held in Dakar, Senegal; it marks the 65th anniversary of diplomatic relations between African countries and China. For the Chinese President Xi Jinping, these decades of relations are marked by “sincere friendship and equality, win-win for mutual benefit and common development, fairness and justice”. Indeed, African countries could learn from China's development experience and even adopt China's best practices to design a development path that is in line with the socio-political realities of the continent. Similarly, China could draw inspiration from African know-how in certain areas. In this perspective, the Journal of Sino-African Studies (JSAS) aims to promote an objective knowledge of China by Africans and of Africa by the Chinese.

Aims & Scopes

The Journal of Sino-African Studies (JSAS) (ISSN online: 2791-3546) is an independent social science journal established in 2022 by the Association for the Promotion of Sino-African Studies (APSAS). It publishes double-blind peer-reviewed articles. It publishes two issues per year, available online and in open access on its website. Publications will be in French, English or Chinese. The journal provides a platform for scholars to publish original and high quality texts related to Sino-African relations in general and in particular the promotion of educational and cultural exchanges between China and African countries.

Writing protocol

- ❖ Manuscripts should be sent by email to the following addresses:

- ❖ On the first page of the articles must appear: The title (and subtitle) of the article (in English and French), the names of the authors, their affiliation, the abstracts (in English and French) and the keywords (in English and French) must appear on the first page of the manuscripts. The article starts on the second page.
- ❖ Authors should present their affiliation as follows: Name of the institution (in full), country. Example: University of Maroua, Cameroon.
- ❖ Articles should respect the following rules:
 - Font Centaur, size 12 for the body text, size 12 in bold for titles, size 10 for footnotes;
 - Line spacing 1.15;
 - Left and right justified margins;
 - Short quotations (less than four lines) in the body of the text using the quotation marks.. Long quotations in a paragraph indented to the left in Centaur font size 10;
 - References: APA 7th edition;;
 - No double line breaks between paragraphs;
 - Limited use of footnotes;
 - Short title with longer subtitles if necessary;
 - No italics, bolding or underlining in the text, except italics for book titles and words from languages other than English;
 - An abstract (about 150 words) and 3 to 5 key words in English and French;
 - The references should be based on the following model
